Dear Parents/Guardians,

Week 2 of Term 2 has gone by very quickly! It's been a productive week... with lots of time in class and few disruptions, which has been lovely.

ANNUAL REPORT

As promised late last term, the Annual Report will be shared in today's newsletters and future editions also. The section shared today is our SCHOOL CONTEXT. Here is the section in its entirety. *Big Hill Primary School is situated on the Calder Highway on the southern fringe of Bendigo. The school has attractive and spacious surrounds (including an adjoining flora and fauna reserve) and purpose built play areas: synthetic sports field, a variety of undercover areas, junior playground (Years Prep and One only), a large adventure playground and also a rope climbing spire. Our families are diverse at Big Hill PS, with a mix of "conventional", split/shared care, single-parent and Out of Home Care (OOHC). Diversity-wise, Big Hill PS enjoys working with a large number of Koorie families, cultural backgrounds (eg. Lebanese, Russian, Asian) and same-sex parents – all of whom add to a very supportive and inclusive culture at the school. Our SFOE is currently mid 0.4s and has fluctuated here for the last 5 years. As our SFOE is low-mid, we have a real mix of families with different socio-economic backgrounds, including a growing number of students funded as "disadvantaged". In the last 3 years, the school has continued to attract students funded under the Program for Students With Disabilities (PSD) as well as a substantial students who have not attracted funding, but have challenging behaviours as a result of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). As a result of this change, staff have undertaken a lot of training to ensure the classroom and school programs are inclusive. Our community really is the school. Big Hill, whilst being a suburb of Bendigo, does not have a general store, post office, sporting club, community hall etc. In addition to this, the school draws from a large area, with many families travelling up to school from Ravenswood (10km to the South), rural areas of Big Hill (eg. Belvoir Park Road), from multiple housing developments in Big Hill and Kangaroo Flat South and from across Bendigo. Due to this, the school is the hub of the community, so engaging families with detailed newsletters, active Facebook Pages (school and Parents and Friends), community events, special nights, weekly assemblies, ongoing awards presentations and an open-door/drop-in culture... are incredibly important to create the links to our geographically spread community. We believe we do this well, but strive to continually improve and build stronger links. Our school's vision is to provide a wide range of learning opportunities and rich experiences that support the development of young individuals with diverse skill sets, enabling them choice of career later in life. As part of our school culture, all students work within our 3 core school values: Be Respectful, Be Responsible and Be Safe. At Big Hill PS, we want not only academically skilled individuals, but well-balanced, resilient and social students ready for any challenge life presents them. 2018 was the year of review for our 2015 - 2018 Strategic Plan. During Term 1, a thorough self-assessment was undertaken, harnessing the opinions and views of our staff, students and parents through different forums/opportunities. This major piece of work, resulted in a positively received School Self Assessment, that eased Big Hill PS into a Term 2 Review with two challenge partners, SEIL and independent reviewer guiding us through this process. At the end of a very exhaustive review, we had clear goals and targets to lead us towards the writing of our 2018-2021 Strategic Plan...which saw us revisit our values and vision and focus our work for the next 4 years. It was also a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our successes, particularly in reading growth, building consistent teaching and learning processes and providing a safe and engaging learning environment for our students.*

Throughout 2018, there have been many key changes to Literacy and Numeracy programs across the school, with continued focus on building staff capacity, collaboration and transparent assessment of learning, particularly ASSESSMENT FOR LEARNING. With major focus on writing throughout much of 2018, the VOICES (Voice, Organisation, Ideas, Conventions, Excellent Word Choice and Sentence Fluency) program was instrumental in creating change and improving student learning outcomes, with a curriculum day with Consultant Samantha Nicolaides the stimulus to get staff moving towards a consistent focus on TRAITS in writing. With regard to numeracy in 2018, the focus of staff professional learning continued to focus on set teaching sequences in mathematics - specifically the 4 processes (computation). At the beginning of 2018, George Booker returned to Big Hill PS and worked within our staff on teaching computation, with the text TEACHING PRIMARY MATHEMATICS used as the main port of call for teaching and learning sequences in mathematics. Further to this, George Booker's Building Numeracy has continued to be used as the main form of data collection (pre and post) to inform teaching and learning sequences. Our school also provides wonderful learning opportunities in addition to Mathematics and English. A comprehensive Chinese (Languages) program operates across the school, as well as a revered (by parents and students) arts program, including one hour per week in both performing arts and visual arts (total 2 hours), structured library sessions, reading intervention, physical education (delivered in 2018 by a specialist for the first time in many years) and integrated OR rotations for other important learning areas such as science, history, technology etc.

Big Hill PS is part of the Team China Bendigo group and hosts up to 4 Chinese students and a teacher for 8 weeks each year – as well as sending up to 4 students and a teacher to Suzhou, China yearly. Two major performing arts productions are also presented to the community each year, involving all classes in acting, singing, instrument playing (guitar, violin, ukulele, marimbas), dancing, set-design, sound, light and technology. Attitudes to School Surveys (ATOSS) from Years 4-6 (2018) have trended positively with our students feeling safe at school, engaged with the curriculum and feeling heard by their teachers (all three factors above the State). Parent Opinion Survey (POS) data from 2018 was patchy however and did not align with the views of students. A very small sample responded to the online invitation to do the survey, with a few negative responses affecting the data with each response equating to around 7%. In future years, it will be important to get a valid sample size to ensure we get valid results that are not easily swayed by a few unfavourable responses. Regardless, throughout 2018 the staff and leadership worked hard with the community to create positive relationships between the school and home and is certainly assisted by a very positive, productive and supportive Parents and Friends group and School Council. Big Hill PS is also a School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) school, with Tier 1 now embedded in our community and multiple elements of Tier 2 in place also. Our Values are well-known and referred to daily (endorsed by the School Review), whilst all children, staff and parents are aware of our behavioural expectations – positively stated in our Expectations Matrix. Positive behaviour is rewarded with Big Rewards, whilst inappropriate behaviour is managed with our Behaviour Management Flow Chart. This, generally, ensures support for our management of behaviours and is supported by our children rating our management of bullying favourably. We introduced Respectful Relationships across the school in 2018 also, with a half a Pupil Free Day used to facilitate training and implementation in classes occurring for the second half of the year.

CAPITAL WORKS

It's been an interesting week on the building site with cranes moving in large support beams and the foundations of the new multipurpose taking shape. Won't be long and we'll start seeing some frames!

TEAM CHINA NEWS – 3 WEEKS TILL WE FLY!

On Wednesday we had our first Pre-Departure Day at Golden Square Primary School. The 4 children and I enjoyed mixing with students and staff from other schools, particularly Camp Hill and Strathfieldsaye who will be part of our smaller travel group. We had Chinese language lessons in preparation for the trip, learnt about cultural differences, watched videos of places we will visit (such as the Great Wall of China, Forbidden City, Shanghai Markets) and played getting to know you games. Our second and final pre-departure day is set for next Tuesday, 7th May from 12:15pm – 2:45pm. Families are reminded to return the permission form for this excursion ASAP and indicate if transport is required for your child. Please also send back the Overnight Stay Permission Form sent home on Tuesday also. Last night our families and students also enjoyed the last information evening before departure. This was held at Specimen Hill PS and outlined final travel arrangements, shared good travel tips/last minute reminders, and the official uniform was also handed out – grape coloured shirts this year!

GRIP LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE - TOMORROW

Tomorrow our School Leaders (Captains and Vice Captains) and Student Voice representatives from the Senior Unit will attend the GRIP LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE at The Bendigo Stadium. Permission forms must be returned, along with payment of \$20, unless other arrangements have been made. Drop off at Bendigo Stadium at 8:45am and pick up at 2:30pm. I'll meet families and students out the front of the stadium. Remember to send students in uniform and with their normal recess and lunch, as well as a drink.

KOORI "CREATIVE ARTS VICTORIA" PROJECT

Thanks to a successful grant that Lauren Adcock submitted, our Koori students will work every Friday afternoon with Koori artists Troy Firebrace and Daikota Nelson. Troy, Daikota and the Koori students will complete the WOMINJEKA (Welcome) project by painting a beautiful piece of Aboriginal / Indigenous art on the wall as you walk into the entrance to the school. Keep an eye on the space as it evolves over the next two terms.

STAFFING UPDATE

You may have heard talk from students that Brett Strange has been at Big Hill PS visiting – this is true, I'm pleased to report. As Brett continues to improve from injury, he is beginning to work for small periods of time in his class, supporting Susie Marsh. The children are loving this... and as Brett continues his recovery, we can expect to see more of him. At least for the next month Susie will continue to work in Brett's class for consistency, with Brett also working several mornings a week. Jono Guy will continue to deliver PE each Thursday. This week we also welcomed two ladies to Big Hill PS who are completing their training as Education Support Officers (ES). Welcome to Belinda Smith who will work in Middle Renae and Kate Duncan who will work in First Steps Nicole.
